World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation is marked by the Catholic Church in union with the Orthodox and other Churches and Christian communities. This year, Pope Francis highlighted the question of water in his message.

Describing the threat to the planet's seas and oceans as an "emergency" he said, "We need to pray as if everything depended on God's providence, and work as if everything depended on us."

He also prayed for the younger generation that they may grow in respect for our common home and in the desire to care for the essential good of water for the benefit of all.

Augustinian Lay Forum

Following our Augustinian Regional gathering of laity in the Bunratty Castle Hotel last May, it was agreed that we would commence our gatherings again in early September to meet with some new members and continue our journey.

This meeting took place last Saturday in Dublin with 25 people in attendance from all other Augustinian houses. Fr. John Hennebry opened the meeting with the challenge 'To move on'. The purpose of the day was to gather as the Augustinian Forum to talk about our faith and the future.

We began by reading and meditating on this piece of scripture.. *Luke 5: 36 He told them this parable: "No one tears a piece out of a new garment to patch an old one. Otherwise, they will have torn the new garment, and the patch from the new will not match the old. 37 And no one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the new wine will burst the skins; the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. 38 No, new wine must be poured into new wineskins. 39 And no one after drinking old wine wants the new, for they say, 'The old is better.'"* it was truly amazing what emerged from this and gave us plenty of room for thought.

As the day progressed we continued working together on dreaming a dream for the new year with the possibility of an Augustinian Synod in 2019. Also to continue talking faith and future, working together collaborating with communal discernment to develop a regional structure for going forward. However this will be a challenge for Augustinians to see beyond the local priory moving forward as to how do we keep *Augustinianism* in Ireland? To finish our task was to arrange and plan for our next regional meetings with ongoing reflection by Augustinian people, both lay and professed.
