This Wednesday 28th we will celebrate the feasts of St. Monica and St. Augustine. I can understand how the anxious mothers of today could identify with St. Monica, his mother. Under the influence of his pagan father Patricius, the young Augustine strayed away from the strong Christian faith in his adolescent years. His restless searching mind lead him into all sorts of strange cults and sects.



It was certainly Monica's years of prayer, holy example, suffering and sacrifices, along with her bold pursuit of Augustine to Milan, that brought her elder son to the faith. He was by far the most troublesome of her three children—all of whom embraced the faith sooner or later.

As Augustinians we owe a lot to St. Monica who gave us somebody who inspires our life and ministry, who presented us with the vision and reality of a community of friends in search of God. As a busy priest and bishop St. Augustine held on to the monastic ideal, the journey inwards to the heart and his passion for people and their problems. With patience and perseverance his mother nurtured his genius and converted him to God's love.

The world is deeply indebted to her. Her son, through his writings, his sermons and his pastoral practice has had profound influence on the direction of theology and spirituality. Her tears and prayers can bring new heart and hope to mothers and to parents trying to keep the communication lines open to their prodigal sons and daughters. Come and celebrate this special relationship between mother and son on Wednesday 28th at the 10.15am Mass , with refreshments after.
