There will be a church gate collection after all Masses this weekend for the Limerick Branch of the Alzheimer Society of Ireland.

The image of the compass rose has, since 1954, been associated with the Anglican Communion and, in fact, forms part of the flag that represents Anglicans throughout the world.

Last week we welcomed members of the Compass Rose Society to St. Augustine's. This is a group that was formed in 1994 to support the work of the Archbishop of Canterbury: they have been involved in significant fundraising for many initiatives of the Anglican Church throughout the world.

This year the group is visiting Ireland and, at the request of Bishop Kenneth Kearon (Church of Ireland Bishop of Limerick and Killaloe), we welcomed the group to our church to give them an insight in to the Roman Catholic Church in Ireland; to get to know what the Augustinians and St. Augustine's are all about; and to chat together about the current state of ecumenism in Ireland.

Bishop Kearon was accompanied by Rev. Niall Sloane (Dean of St. Mary's Cathedral) and a group of about 15 people, from the USA, Canada and Uruguay. Among them were the Anglican bishop of Texas (Rt. Rev. Andrew Doyle) and another, retired bishop, also from the USA; the other members of the group are all lay people who represent different parts of the Anglican Communion and work on its behalf.

We spoke about what we do here at St. Augustine's; about some of the issues concerning both churches in modern Ireland; about formation for ministry; about what we are trying to achieve through the Ostia Community; and the local expression and experiences of ecumenism. This was a very interesting dialogue in which we all could learn from one another and inform ourselves regarding other opinions and experiences.



This, informal gathering, is just one of the many moments of practical ecumenical encounter that happen in the normal day-to-day of church life and which enrich all those who take part in them. The Compass Rose Society were very grateful for the welcome they received here and send their best wishes to all of us here in St. Augustine's.

'Light In The Darkness Lunchtime Talks':

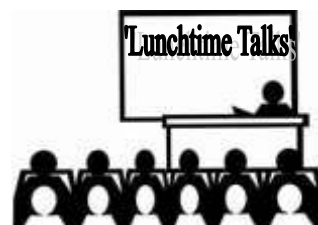
