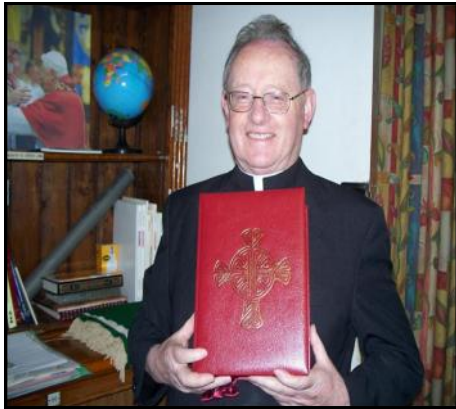

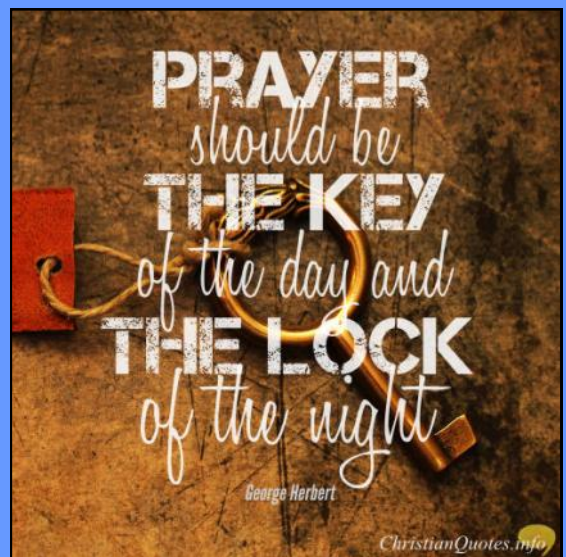

## New Statue at Knock

A new statue of St. Joseph arrived in Knock recently. Commissioned by Knock Shrine and crafted by Ferdinand Stuflesser 1875 Studios, depicts St. Joseph as he was described in the witness accounts of his appearance at Knock in August 1879. The statue will be installed in the Parish Church of St John the Baptist during a special Triduum to St Joseph later this year.
