Who Wins?

There are those now last who will be first and those now first who will be last. (Today's gospel).

Aged 25, Paul J Meyer was the best-paid life insurance salesman in the US. At 27, he was youngest in a special class of salespeople called *The Million Dollar Round Table* and at 32 he founded the *Success Motivation Institute* of Waco, Texas. This latter body grew and grew and Paul's own income ranged from \$5 to 50 million per year for over fifty years. (To be fair, his Foundation gave tens of millions to charities).

The *Success Motivation Institute* was perhaps ten years



old when it's reps tried to sell its *Personal Development and Self-improvement Program* to the Irish province of the Augustinians. We, seminarians, lived in Ballyboden at the time and our Fr Provincial was there too. He asked some of us to meet the reps, listen to their sales pitch and tell him what we thought. The team he picked comprised a Tipperary intellectual, a bright spark from Cork and—he still thought being in better company might bring me on a bit —myself.

The brainy man from Tipp and the sharp Corkman would recall more details than I, but I do remember this: They showed us a filmed recording of the finish of a horse race. It seemed to us it might be a dead heat but they pointed to one horse, saying *he won*. They then asked what we thought was the difference. The intellectual said an inch or less. I said a nose and the Corkman opined millimetres—that was in pre-decimal days but he was a mathematician. Our educators triumphantly announced that we were all wrong, the difference was \$200,000 in prize-money, not counting incalculable future loot from stud fees. At this, the chief rep. of the

Success Motivation Institute of Waco, Texas, thumped the table and said, it is so because one horse had the Slight Edge over the other. **"And that's what we're here to offer you, our program would give you the slight edge over your rivals and the slight edge makes all the difference."**

Paraphrasing the man in the gospel we asked *And who is our rival?*

"Whoever you're competing with, he replied, like the next parish".

Having no wish to wipe out the newly-

established Ballyroan parish, or indeed old Glencullen on the other side, we reported to the Provincial recommending no deal. He agreed, probably having so decided long before.

The aim of the package being sold by the *Success Motivation Institute* was probably fine in business, and certainly fine in sport. But taking it into general life and, still more, into religion, **would be give problems. It's hard to see how Jesus's "those last who will be first and those now first who will be last" might fit into it.**

When the last race is run the great Stewards Enquiry in the sky may turn up some surprising results. **The population of the winners' enclosure might shock many who had always thought we had the slight edge. Even the bookies may have to pay attention to some erstwhile "losers."**
